Temporary increase of official controls governing the entry of certain goods into the EU from India – Inclusion of drumstick, yard long beans and bottle gourd

Regulation (EU) 2019/1793 ("governing Regulation") governs the import conditions for certain food products from non-EU countries due to identified risks from contaminants such as pesticide residues.

Annex I of the governing Regulation lists products subject to increased frequency of identity and physical checks at EU borders.

Annex II of the governing Regulation lists products subject to increased frequency of identity and physical checks at EU borders along with official certificate issued by the competent authority and laboratory testing results from the country of origin or dispatch.

Both Annex I and Annex II prescribe the frequency of identify and physical checks for various products and for various countries and the particular hazard intended to be checked.

The EU conducts a review of the frequency checks bi-annually based on notifications generated by the Rapid Alert System for Food and Feed (RASFF), third country monitoring reports and Member state inspection data.

The EU has recently conducted the 12th Review of the governing Regulation. Subsequent to this review, the EU issued European Regulation (EU) 2025/1441 dated 18 July 2025 amending the frequency checks for certain products originating from India. The changes are summarized in the table below:

The increase in official controls is attributed to high rate of non-compliance with the relevant regulatory requirements prescribed by the EU with respect to various contaminants such as aflatoxins, pesticide residues in exceeding levels resulting in a high number of RASFF alerts.

The Regulation will be implemented with effect from 20 days of its notification. However, consignments of drumsticks and yard long beans originating in India and dispatched (whether from India or a third country) before may enter the EU until 12 October 2025 without being accompanied by the results of sampling and analyses and the official certificate required to be provided along with the consignments.

The full list of the products listed in Annex I and Annex II and pertaining to products originating in India, along with the details of the frequency of identity and physical checks and the identified hazard is annexed to this advisory.

It is brought to the attention of all exporters from India that the EU keeps revising the frequency of checks and the products under import control from time to time. All exporters are advised to keep themselves updated on revisions effected to the parent Regulation, which is available at https://eurlex.europa.eu/eli/reg_impl/2019/1793/oj/eng

In view of the above, exporters from India are advised to take appropriate measures to ensure that exported commodities from India meet the relevant regulatory requirements prescribed by the EU. Any violations notified in RASFF shall be followed by appropriate action by the competent authority as per the Standard Operating Procedure To Handle Rapid Alert (RASFF) and Complaints For APEDA Scheduled Products (available at https://apeda.gov.in/hindi/sites/default/files/export_procedures/SOP_RASFF-Complaints-for-APEDA-Products_0.pdf).
